I have enclosed a copy of my drivers license as requested. You should note my correct address as listed on my license is the exact address I used when signing up with your company. You may also view my business web site www.zucklaw.com should you need further proof. This also could have been easily found during your diligent public record review. I also can be found on the Indiana University school of law web site listed as an adjunct professor. A search of the public records would also reveal I am a lawyer in good standing with the state of Indiana.

Should you need even further verification please see my other website lammarkzuckerberg.com. This is a web site I created when I was "thrown off" Facebook for exactly the same reason your company disabled my account. As you can see from the multitude of links the press had a field day with my press release after I pointed out their error. I trust my account will be reactivated promptly to avoid the same unfortunate press.
